Protecting Our Water Resources: Proper Hazardous Waste Disposal

SEE: What is hazardous waste?

Some products we use in and around our homes can harm people and pollute our rivers, lakes, and drinking water. These items re called "household hazardous waste". Examples are cleaning products like bleach, medication, drain cleaners, paint, pesticides, antifreeze, and motor oil.



JUDGE: How can I help protect our water resources?

Pope Francis reminds us, "Fresh drinking water is an issue of primary importance, since it is indispensable for human life and for supporting terrestrial and aquatic systems" (Laudato Si', 28). Household hazardous waste requires safe disposal, and it should never be dumped down household or storm drains, thrown in the trash, or dumped on the ground. Through proper hazardous waste disposal we help protect our life-sustaining water resources from contamination, and we contribute to the common good—for our brothers and sisters and all eco-systems.

ACT: How do I properly dispose of household hazardous waste?

- Rochester Hills residents use SOCRRA at 9595 Coolidge Rd. in Troy. Prior to drop-off, get details and must make an appointment at https://www.socrra.org/ and purchase a \$10 SOCRRA voucher from the Rochester Hills City Clerk (in person or online). Bring printed voucher and proof of residency. Electronics recycling included.
- Oakland Township and Rochester residents use NoHaz. Oakland Township residents must pay \$15, free to
 Rochester residents. Electronics recycling included. Check website for next collection event, to pre-register, pay,
 and get details: https://www.oakgov.com/community/community-development/waste-recycling/nohaz
- All/Other Cities: Go to your city's website and search on "hazardous waste" to get details.
- Medication can be disposed of at Meijer pharmacies and through Operation Medicine Cabinet (for police station drop-off sites see website https://www.oakgov.com/government/sheriff/community-services/domestic-safety/operation-medicine-cabinet.)
